

LADE Post-School Outcomes Survey Procedures to address SPP Indicator 14

The Public Education Department, Special Education Bureau conducts an annual State-Wide Follow-up Study, as a mandated requirement of the federally approved State Performance Plan to provide follow-up information about students who have exited from school. The SPP Indicator 14 survey is conducted as a census of school districts. All districts, state supported schools, and charter schools operating as districts that serve high school students are required to report. Note that if districts do not report the outcomes of at least 50% of their former students, justification of the missing data is required. All districts are required to report, even if they had no high school students that exited in the reporting year. Therefore, LADE will follow the steps listed below.

Tier 1: Current Graduating Seniors with IEPs

Every April, the Special Education Coordinator will meet with each senior that has an IEP to complete the Tier 1 Student Exit Survey on paper. The coordinator will then transfer the information on behalf of the student into the NEREC/REC#4 online portal.

Tier 2: Previous Year Graduates with IEPs

Every April, the Special Education Coordinator will contact the Tier 2 students via phone to fill out the Tier 2 Student Exit Survey on paper. If unable to reach the student, the coordinator will contact parent/guardian. The coordinator will transfer the survey information on behalf of the students into NEREC/REC#4 online portal.

Both Tier 1 & Tier 2 forms will be completed by May 22nd.
